Have you heard about the Penguin Project?

Our theater friend Morrie Enders, Executive Director at the Lincoln CommunityPlayhouse, loves to talk about The Penguin Project.
Established in 2004, The Penguin Project has evolved into a National program, with Chapter sites throughout the United States. The program provides a supportive environment for children with disabilities to explore their creative talents. It has also demonstrated that participation in the performing arts has therapeutic value by enhancing social interaction, communication skills, self-

confidence, and self-esteem. The impact of

the program has reached beyond the stage to create a social network for children who previously had very few friends and limited social opportunities.

In Peoria, Illinois, once a year a group of children take to the stage to perform a modified version of a well-known Broadway musical. These productions are unique, however, because all the roles are filled by young artists with developmental disabilities including Down syndrome, cerebral palsy, autism, intellectual disabilities, learning disabilities visual impairment, hearing impairment, and other neurological disorders. They are joined on stage by a dedicated group of "peer mentors" – children the same age without disabilities who have volunteered to work side-by-side with them through four months of rehearsals and through the final performance. By providing access to community theater, *The Penguin Project* demonstrates that the special challenges of a disability should not handicap a child's ability to participate in life's experiences.



Regional Reports

Central—The Regional Rep is working on setting up their first meeting of the delegates. The regional festival is scheduled for June 6 at Licking County Players. — *Timothy Pierce, Central Regional Rep*

East—The Region still needs to set up a delegates meeting. The regional festival has been set for June 7 in Coshocton. —Christy Rahrig, East Regional Rep **North**—The Region held their first meeting on September 28 in Bellevue with 4 theaters represented. Jason Chandler, Donna Jean Evans, and Deb Wentz were elected as Regional Reps. Topics of discussion were the regional festival, finances, fundraisers, and future meeting dates.

The Region held their second meeting on November 9 in Sandusky with 6 theaters represented. Deb and Donna Jean gave a summary of the OCTA Board Retreat and



Northeast—The Regional Reps have been training with Dawna Kornick and will be scheduling a delegate meeting soon. Callboards and the Facebook page have been updated. They are talking with Hudson Players about hosting the regional festival on June 20. — *Andrea Anderson, Northeast Regional Rep*

Northwest—The Regional Reps have met twice but have not yet met with the delegates. They are planning meetings in January, February, and March. The regional festival has been scheduled for June 27-28 at Owens Community College.

Southeast—The Region met on November 2 in Jackson with 5 delegates, a Regional Rep, 2 OCTA Board members, and 5 guests present. Items discussed were the 8 new regions, state meeting dates, job description of the theater delegates, OCTA Brochure, OCTA fee schedule, regional meetings, and theater seasons. The next meeting is December 14 in Jackson. —*Frances Gibser, Southeast Regional Rep*

Southwest—The Regional Reps met on November 26 at St. Rita's School for the Deaf. The regional festival is scheduled for June 18-19-20 at Miami University Parrish Auditorium in Hamilton.—*Kevin Noll, Southwest Rep*

West—The Region met on November 16 in Troy with 4 theaters represented. The Regional Reps have divided up the theaters including the 3 new theaters. They talked about the competitions, scholarships, Hall of Fame, Spirit of Community Theatre awards, and Guide/Respondent program. The regional festival is scheduled for July 11 in Sidney. The next meeting will be March 28 at Brookville Community Theatre. —*Christi Thomas, West Rep*

Division Reports

Administrative Division—Members reviewed several policies and made some recommendations for changes which will be voted on by the Board at the January meeting. The Hall of Fame nomination form has been updated and is on the OCTA website.

Fundraising Division—Members reviewed suggestions for fundraising submitted at the Board Retreat. The patron letters were reviewed before they were sent out as well as the logo items. New levels in the Patron program were discussed.

MM/PR Division—The OCTA Brochure has been updated and it is the plan of the division members to visit all theaters to give them a listing of all of OCTA's resources.

The Resource Directory has been updated and is on the OCTA website. It will be updated again next July. If you log on and see an error, let your OCTA delegate know so they can let the Regional Rep know who will pass the information on to Thom Ogilvie. A webmaster is still needed for OCTA's website. The division will be working on updating their policies, job descriptions, and long range plans at the January meeting. [Note: The budget was adjusted for publishing the Brochure. Christi will have it printed and bring it to the January meeting.]

Programming Division—In October, division members reviewed OCTAFest rules, Responder fees, OCTA Jr.,

fundraising for festival funds, 2020 Regional Festival dates, and came up with a bunch of brainstorming ideas.

At the December meeting, the division discussed policies, OCTA Jr. (location and funds), and a few potential rule changes for festivals.

Dan Maloney, 2020 Conference Chair, reported on tentative workshop ideas, a game that will be running all weekend so people can win door prizes, registration costs, and money saving ideas.

Also at the December meeting, the Board voted to hold the 2021 Conference at Cherry Valley Hotel in Newark (site of the 2019 Board Retreat) with Gladys Haney and Aara Wise as Conference Co-chairs.

Meeting Notes:

- •The 2020 Budget was approved. Aara reported that all the bills for 2019 have been paid except for one that is outstanding.
- •The 2020 Membership Dues Invoices have been sent out, due back by January 31. Everyone needs to remind all their theaters to be sure and fill out the blue update sheet which will be included with the dues notices.
- •Aara also reminded people that OCTA purchases are tax exempt, but you must use the Tax Exempt form as taxes paid will not be reimbursed.
- •The 990 IRS form has been completed and filed along with the charitable registration report.
- •The Board also voted to accept the contract from Cherry Valley Hotel for 2022. The Hotel has spent "big bucks" on renovations and is shaping up to be a great venue for OCTA State Conference.
- •The Board voted to hire Betsy Willis to work on applying for grants for OCTA.
